Course Description - students will cover:

Number and Quantity: Real and Complex Number Systems
Algebra: Expressions, Equations and Inequalities
Functions: Write and Interpret Linear, Quadratic, Exponential and Trigonometric functions
Geometry: Similar Triangles, Circles, Measurement and Dimension
Statistics: Categorical and Quantitative Data, Conditional Probability

## Grade Breakdown - Weighted categories

- Assignments ( $15 \%$ ) - Assignments are given almost daily and are due two school days after the day assigned. Homework turned in on time will be graded within 24 hours. Late assignments will be graded at teacher convenience. Hw turned in after the test has been taken will receive partial credit. There will be a hard deadline at midterm as well as at the end of each trimester. Assignments not finished in class are to be completed at home or during FLEX.
- Quizzes ( $40 \%$ ) - Every Friday there will be a bell ringer quiz. These are short quizzes with exact problems from bell ringers. There will also be Standards Quizzes within each unit. Students are required to retake any Standards Quiz where they score below 65\%. May retake up to two times and the newest score will be kept.
- Tests (30\%) - Exams are comprehensive and may cover any material taught during the course. There are usually two exams per trimester. Students are allowed ONE retake per exam.
- Final Exam (15\%) - A comprehensive final exam will be given at the end of the trimester. All the material covered in Math 2 up to the test date will be included on the exam. We will work hard to prepare as there will NOT be any retakes for the Final Exam.
