RHS Secondary Math I Honors Disclosure

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Course Description

The fundamental purpose of Secondary Math 1 is to formalize and extend the mathematics that students learned in the middle grades. The critical areas deepen and extend understanding of linear relationships, in part by contrasting them with exponential phenomena, and in part by applying linear models to data that exhibit a linear trend. Secondary Math 1 uses properties and theorems involving congruent figures to deepen and extend understanding of geometric knowledge from prior grades. The final unit in the course ties together the algebraic and geometric ideas studied. Math I Honors extends the course by including introductions in matrices, vectors and logic.

Grade Breakdown – Weighted categories

- Tests (50%) Tests are given at the end of each unit. Students are allowed ONE retake per exam. The retake must be taken before or after school, or during FLEX. Retakes are only accepted up until the next test day. If you choose to retake a test, the retake score goes on your grade even if it's worse than the original score.
- Assignments (30%) Assignments are given daily and are due two school days later. Homework turned in on time will be graded within 24 hours. *Late assignments will be graded at teacher convenience*. Assignments not finished in class are to be completed at home or during FLEX.
- **Bell Ringer Quizzes (10%)** Several bell ringer quizzes will be given throughout the trimester. These are short quizzes with exact problems from bell ringers with **no retakes.**
- **Final Exam (10%)** A comprehensive final will be given at the end of the trimester. We will work hard to prepare as there will **NOT** be any retakes for the Final Exam.
